What happened? What is being done? (Describe corrective action) We do Lead and Capper testing once every 3 years. After our testing ended in BORI we had made a change in one of our sample sites. When collecting our samples for the 2024 sampling period we had mistakenly collected our samples. Using our 2021 approved sample site list instead of our new revised sample sites for 2024 effectively oxcluding our one new sample site.
